

Two New England Students to CSCMP Annual Conference

The New England Roundtable of the Council of Supply Chain Management Professionals is pleased to announce the award of two trips to area students to represent our Roundtable at the 2007 Council of Supply Chain Management Professionals Annual Conference, October 21-24, in Philadelphia, PA as members of the Arrangements Committee.
